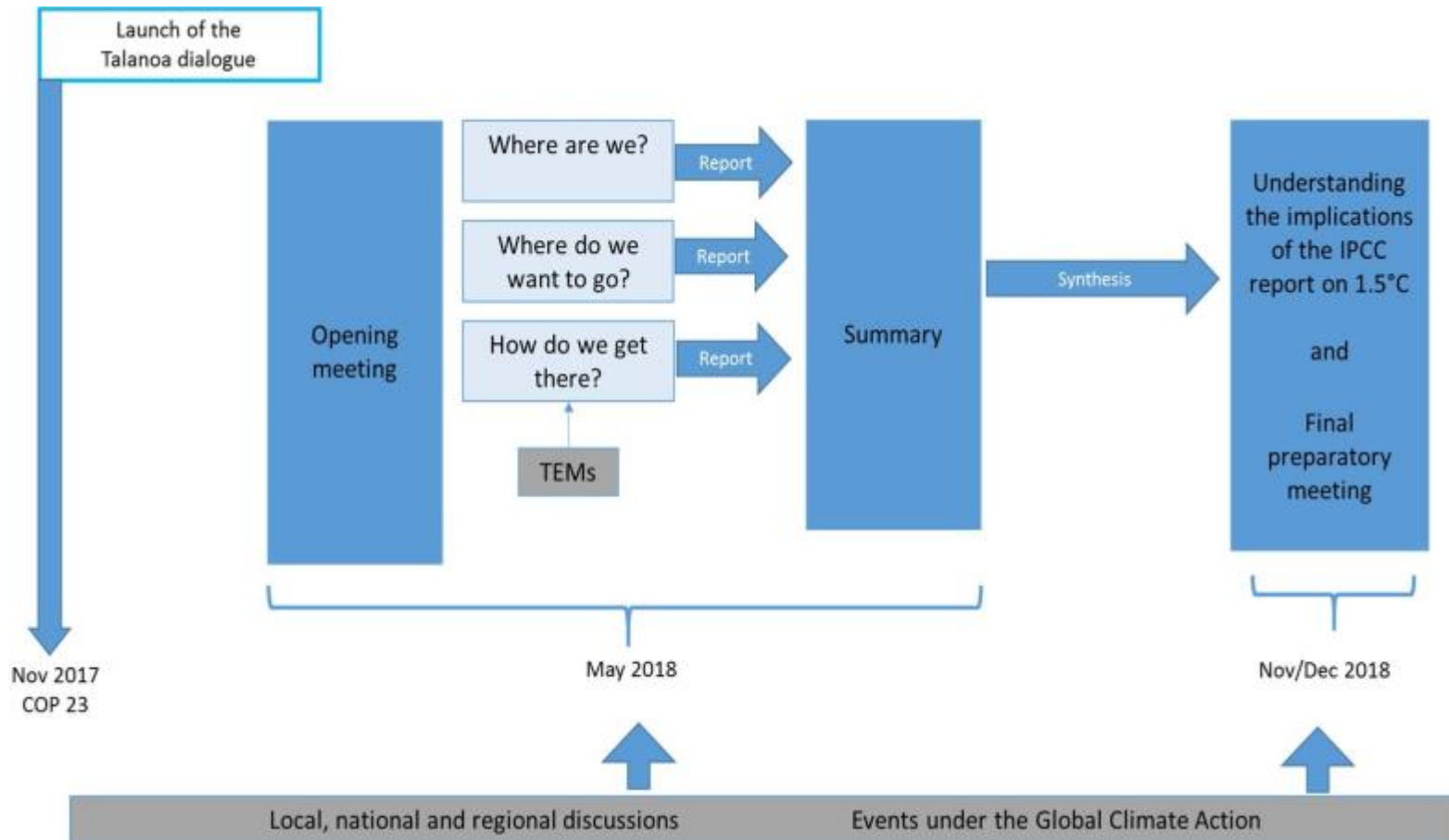


COP23 – ICLEI’s 5 Key takeaways

1. COP23 proved that the Paris Agreement is unstoppable and irreversible – where local and regional governments are positioned to be a strong custodian.
2. National goals are not strong enough and the global emissions gap is huge – This is the perfect time to engage local and regional governments in delivering national commitments and raise ambitions globally.
3. The Talanoa Dialogue opens the door wide open for multilevel and multistakeholder partnerships – Local and regional governments now have the opportunity and duty to extend this to every city and region in the world.
4. Advancing the Paris Agreement Work Program has enabled progress in building a strong global climate architecture.
5. The road ahead – we have 3 critical years ahead of us to safeguard Paris Agreement and the global climate.

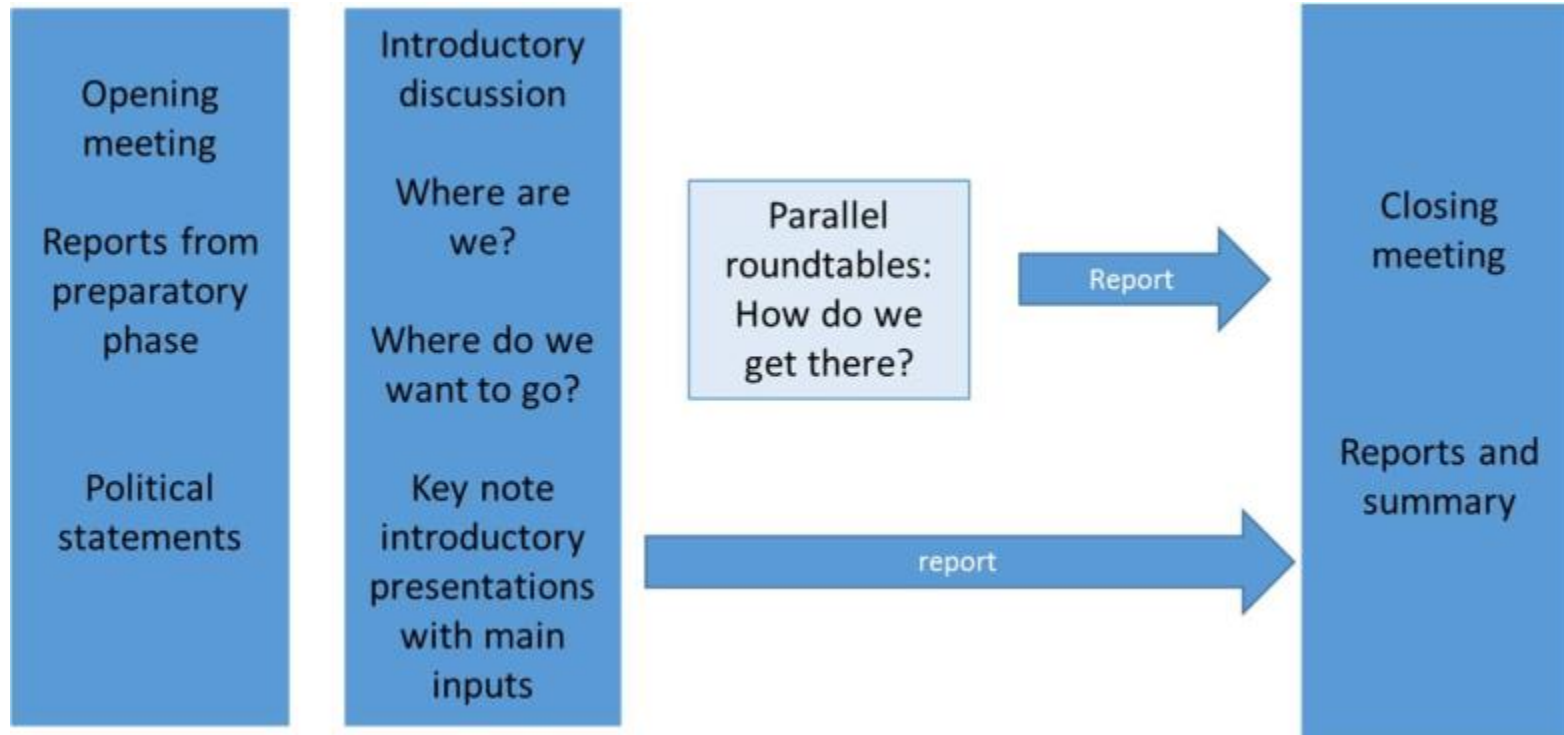


Talanoa Dialogue: Preparatory phase

Success factors

A. INTERNAL

1. Timing of the Summit and building the other events around it
2. Ambitious mobilization and diversity in unity – levels of governments, geographical coverage, typology of jurisdictions engaged and represented, inclusive approach for recognition of all networks
3. Strength in coverage of themes and linkage to initiatives

B. EXTERNAL

1. Strong and fruitful collaboration with COP Presidencies towards and at COPs
2. Close collaboration with the UNFCCC Secretariat and the Marrakech Partnership, including the Bonn Zone as the venue of the Summit
3. Pro-active coverage of the negotiation process

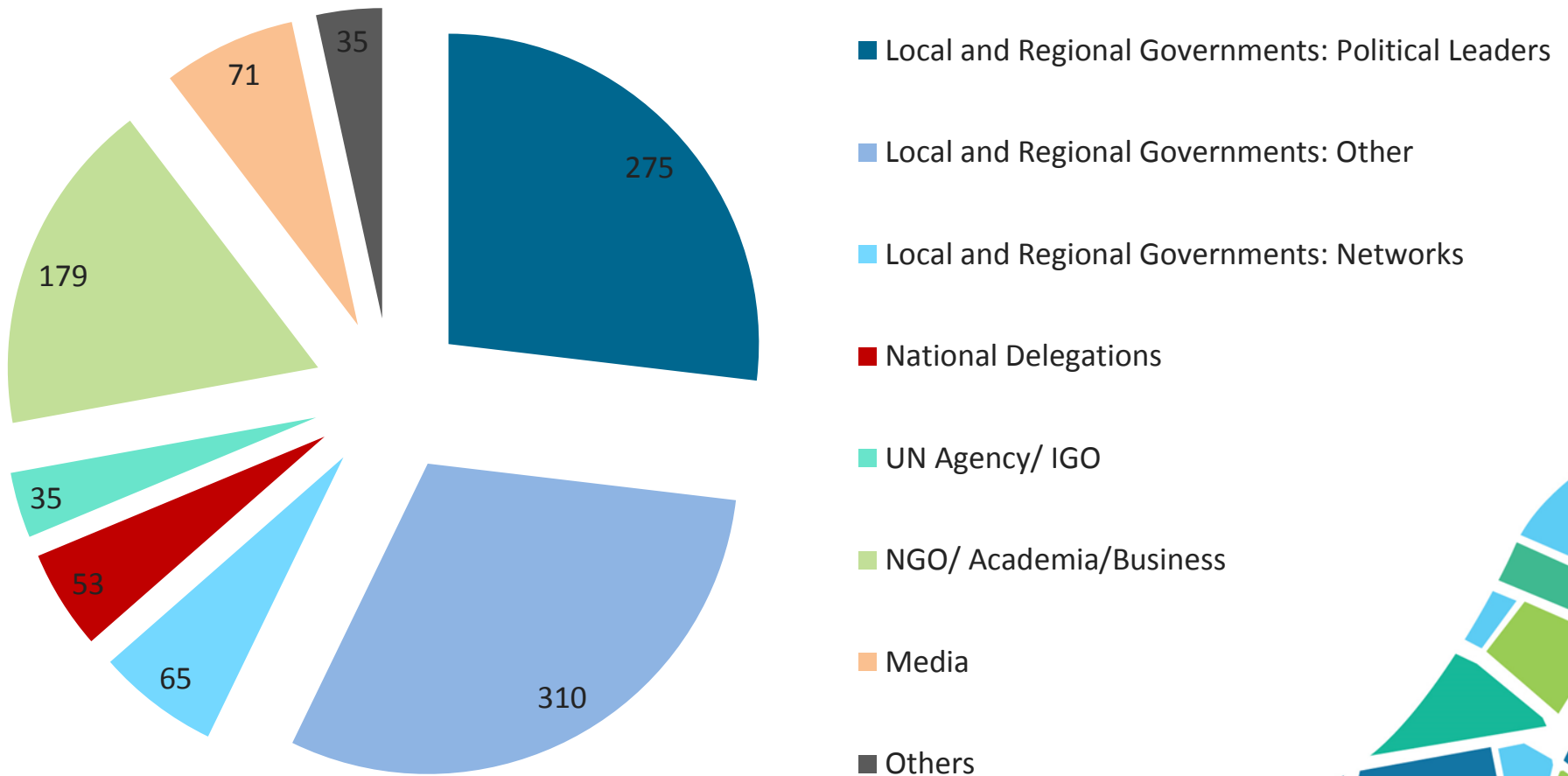

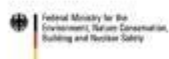
